Enforcement

- 1. This Ordinance may be enforced by the Rumsey Tribal Gaming Agency by implementation of monetary fines not to access \$500 and/or withdrawal of suthorization to sell alcohol at the Panlity. Prior to any enforcement action, the Rumsey Tribal Gaming Agency shall provide the alleged offender of this ordinance with at least three [3] days notice of an opportunity to be heard during a specially-called meeting. The decision of the Rumsey Tribal Gaming Agency shall be final.
- I. This Ordinance also may be enforced by the Yolo County Sheriff's Office at the request of the Rumsey Tribal Caming Agency.

Severability

Hany provision or application of this ordinance is determined by review to be invelid, such adjudication shall not be hald to render ineffectual the rangining portions of this title or to render such provisions inapplicable to other persons or circumstances.

Amendment

This ordinance may only be amended by a majority vote of the Tribal Council.

Sovereign Immunity

Nothing in this ordinance in any way limits, sizes, restricts or waives the Tribe's sovereign immunity from unconsented suit or action.

Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective following its certification by the Secretary of the Interior and its publication in the Passaral Register.

L Sale and Consumption of Aicoholic Beverages

The General Council of the San Pasquel Band of Mission Indiana (hereinafter General Council), governing body of the San Pasquel Band (hereinafter Tribe), hereby marts this Ordinance to govern the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages within casino facilities on Reservation lands.

II. Preamble

1. Title 18, United States Code, Section 1161, provider Indian tribes with suthority to enact ordicences governing the consumption and sale of alcoholic beverages on their Reservations, provided such ordinance is certified by the Secretary of the Interior, published in the Federal Register and such activities are in conformity with state law.

2. Pursuant to Article IV. Section 1 of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Sen Pasqual Sand, the General Council is the governing body of the Tribe, with the power to enset ordinances to promote the general welfare and economic advancement of the Tribe and

its members.

3. The Tribe is the owner and operator of a gaming facility located on the Reservation known as the Valley View (Casino), at which (Clara if and Clasa III Gaming is conducted pursuant to the Tribe's Gaming Ordinance and a Compact executed with the State of California on September 10, 1999, ratified by the California Legislature, approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 8, 2000, and published in the Redeval Register on May 18, 2000.

4. The Casino, located on trust land, is an integral and indispensable part of the Tribs's scornery, and is intended to provide income to the Tribs and training and employment to its manufacts.

3. The General Council has determined that it is now in the best interest of the Tribe to offer elcoholic - baverages for sale and consumption in

the Casino,

6. It is the purpose of this Ordinance to set out the beam and conditions under which the sale and consumption of said alcoholic beverages may take

IIL Gonoral Terms

1. The sale and consumption of elocholic beroceges within the Carino, for on-premises communication only, is

hereby authorized.

2. For the purpose of this Ordinance, the term Cacino shall mean the Valley View Casino, as currently existing or as expanded in the future, or any other casina facility owned by the Tribe and located on the San Pasqual Indian Reservation.

3. The rale of said alcoholic bevarages authorized by this Ordinance shall be in conformity with all applicable laws of the State of California and applicable federal laws, and the sale of said beverages shall be subject to federal excise tex and any fees required by the Federal Bursey of Alcohol, Tobacco & Firearms. This includes but is not Limited to the following:

a. No person ander the age of 31 years shall commune, acquire or have in his or

har possession any alcoholic beverage.

b. No person shall sell any alcoholic passars to any berson under the see

c. No person shall sell alcoholic beverages to a person apparently under the influence of sicobol.

4. Where there may be a question of a parana's right to purchase liquor by reason of his or her egg, such person shall be required to proceed anyone of the following types of identification which shows his or her correct age and been his or her signature and photographe (1) Driver's license or identification card issued by any state Department of Motor Vehicles; (2) United States Active Duty Military card: or (3) passport.

8. All liquor sales within the Casino shall be on a cash only baris and no credit shall be extended to any person, organization or entity, except that this he are not provered too each necessive major credit or debit cards.

This Ordinance shall be conspicuously posted within the Casino at all times it is open to the public.

V. Enforcement

The San Pasqual Gaming Commission may enforce this Ordinance by

implementation of monetary fines not to exceed \$500 per violation. Prior to any enforcement action, the Gaming Commission shall provide the alleged offender of this Ordinance with at least thres (8) days notice of an opportunity to be heard during a specially called meeting. The decision of the Caming Commission shall be final.
