An act to add Section 1241.5 to the Water Code, relating to Indian water rights.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1241.5 is added to the Water Code, to The laws of this State with respect to loss of water read: rights by nonuse, abandonment, prescription, and lack of dili-

gence shall not apply to water rights appurtenant to or for use on any trust land for the period of five years following the conveyance by the United States of an unrestricted title to the land and the water rights appurtenant to or for use on

As used in this section, "trust land" means any land in this State (a) to which the United States holds title in trust for any tribe, band, or other group of Indians, or for any particular Indian; or (b) owned by a particular Indian or any tribe, band, or group of Indians subject to a restriction against alienation imposed by the United States; or (c) held by the United States for the use of Indians in California, but not for any particular tribe, band, or group of Indians, or any particular Indian, if any part of such land is occupied by Indians or their families.

The Legislature hereby finds and declares that because of historical conditions, the Indians of California will not be in 20 a position fully to utilize and to protect water rights owned by 21 them when unrestricted title to trust land is conveyed to them. by the United States. regard to such land and water rights so that they will not lose
the benefit of the water rights and the opportunity to make
productive utilization of their land. The Legislature further
finds and declares that such a suspension of the laws of this
State with regard to such water rights is in the public interest
and will promote the public welfare since it will promote the
economic and social well-being of the Indians and the communities in which they reside and will encourage the selfsufficiency of the Indians.
