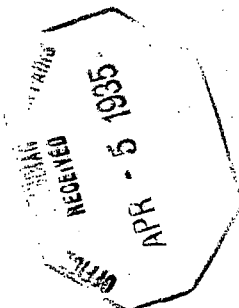

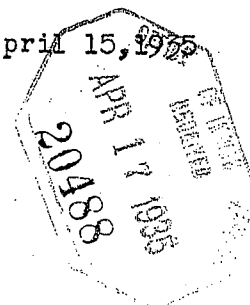

Subject: Special Elections, Indian Reorganization Act  
Your Telegram of Even Date



Sir:

Your telegram refers to "all groups listed your report Jany sixteen who have not yet voted."

On April 13 I airmailed you my recommendation that Friday, May 24, be set for Fort Independence under Walker River; and for Summit Lake under Carson. Friday, June 7, would be just as convenient.

I assume you refer to these, which are the only two bona fide reservations which have not voted. If you meant by groups the rancherias as well, the voting would have to be spread over four or five days with 48 hours between elections, because there is not sufficient supervisory personnel to cover 50 or 60 places on the same day.
