Re: S. 338 (Feinstein): Lytton Gaming Oversight Act

Dear Senator Feinstein:

The California State Association of Counties (CSAC), the single, unified voice speaking on behalf of all 58 California counties, would like to express our appreciation to you for introducing and successfully moving your bill, S. 338, through the United State Senate.

As you know, S. 338 would require the Lytton Band of Pomo Indians to follow the twopart determination process established under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (IGRA) before engaging in Class III gaming. The legislation would allow the tribe to continue operating its Class II facility at the current site, but would preclude any expansion of the facility.

CSAC supports the position that all class II and class III gaming devices should be subject to IGRA and the two-part determination test. As you know, California's counties are at the forefront of responding to the myriad of challenges associated with the alarming rise of off-reservation Indian casinos in our state. In particular, county governments have been forced to expend considerable resources as a result of addressing the numerous local impacts caused by off-reservation gaming operations, including impacts related to traffic congestion, water/wastewater management, criminal justice/public safety matters, and health/social services issues. Accordingly, CSAC supports S. 338, which provides that the Lytton tribe work on a government-to-government basis with the State and counties in a respectful, positive and constructive manner to mitigate off-reservation impacts from casinos, while preserving tribal governments' right to self-governance and to pursue economic self-reliance.

Once again, thank you for introducing S. 338. CSAC is pleased to support this important measure.
