SOC (Save Our Communities) consists of concerned citizens from the three residential communities in the immediate vicinity of the proposed fee-to-trust land annexation by the Soboba Band of Luiseno Indians. We are opposed to the annexation of the Horseshoe Grande property consisting of 534.91 +/- acres into a fee-to-trust for the Soboba Tribe and desire the land remain within the boundaries and jurisdiction of the City of San Jacinto, County of Riverside, with its current light residential, recreational zoning intact.


Members of our organization are concerned that the surrounding communities, local governments and the state government may not have meaningful input into the expansion of reservations for the purpose of gaming. We support SB 338 and believe that all applications in California should be processed as a two-part determination.

The impact of casino traffic, gasoline emissions, noise and light pollution, crime, inadequate disaster evacuation procedures, communities becoming islands surrounded by reservation land, and the possible confusion of emergency services are only some of the issues that concern our citizens.


Thank you for your efforts to create more oversight in the development of Indian gaming.
