Dear Senator Feinstein,

Our community action group, Jamulians Against the Casino, support your position for an equitable and fair policy for both tribes, the State and local communities. Our organization is comprised of well over 500 active community members. We live in a rural area of San Diego County, next to the Mexican border, on a two lane road, Highway 94. Our County currently has the highest number of Indian casinos in the State. We have been embroiled in a battle with a tribe, which was recognized in 1983, for over 15 years. The tribe backed by a casino developer/management group purchased 101 acres of land and is trying to take the land into Trust for the sole purpose of a casino and auxiliary uses. JAC and the communities of Jamul, Dulzura and Rancho San Diego have worked diligently to have the tribe mitigate the incredible impacts their proposed casino would bring to the area. There are serious and un-mitigable impacts for traffic, law enforcement, emergency services, air quality, water, sewage, rural character to name a few. In addition, the property is adjacent to a unique habitat preserve.

The Two – Part Determination Process would be beneficial not only for the Lytton Band and surrounding communities but for all Californians. The Two-Part Determination Process would give everyone a voice and better oversight. We encourage you to expand SB 338 to encompass all tribes seeking to acquire lands for gaming purposes.
