In iurthar reference to your letter of July 29th, acieressed to tho Canissioner of In cion Affairs, regarding the homeless condition of tie Indians residing in your County, I ar: now in receipt of a letter from tho Assistant Coranissioner of Indian Affairs, dated Aurist 50, 1933, in which lie states that there is a possibility that funds mi. !.t to sociurud . fth which to establish colony oi those Indians on the 70 gore tract of land know an the Broca Vista ilanoheria located a females from trio town of lone.

Before mating definite reocmencations I should ike to ascertain if the Indians in your vicinity would bo willing to move to this rancheria in ouse funds can be scoured witli winch to build houses nd make other necessay improvements. In tall ing th sone of them last year I jot the imprison they were not much interacted in the colony plan; t!:oy soor.ed to think they have a bettor chance to jet work and maze aivinci if they have their homes in or near tic moro cionsely populated seotions o! tho country

Lr. i.erriweather stated to me recently that several families of these Indians are living: in rudely constructed slacks on the outskirts of your town on land belonifing to a Chinaman and that this land is about to vo sold and tho Indians dispossessed. It would seem, therefore, that it is imperative that sone arranjement be made to provide hames for than elsewhere.

In addition to the Buena Vista rancheria of 70 acres, yo liavo 370 acres of lind in your County near Jacks an, which :hes purchased for hamesitos for Indians several years eco, inc et ole tine several families lived there. Now thor is living: on this land only Joe look and his son,

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bota in ono hrasa, Tho otler housa: have all woen abunctoned by tho lucians for thom thoy were duilt und havo beoomo uni'st for oooupancy. It is believed, however, that this Juaizon rancioria, beint much larger tian the Buens Ficta and looatid noar a naín highway, with more water, liatter land and consiciorable timber is bottor suitod for a oolony and has crecter jossivilities in evary wa, than the 70 acres troun as tiso Leuna Vista rancheria.

I :oulc approciate it if your Conimitteo would confor iith somo of the lecdini Indians in your cormunity and tien aivise nee as to what thoy tlink oi' this propocition. It niflit wo rell if your Compiltiee could visit both or tlese tracts oi lond, tokinc soul oi ti:e Indians with you, and see for yoursclves juct ho: they aro situated. The amount of
1 and that can le cultivatod, tho :atator supply, the chanoes for the Incians seourin; employment in the immediate vicinity, etc., are inportant matters to do considered.
is you no doubt know, it would be a waste of offort anc money to undertaje to locato these Indime on eithor of these tracts of land if they prefer sowe other arranceriont. This was boon ciemonstrated on the Jackson ranclieria where sevoral years aco a number of gnall houses were built for Incian familiee vilo have lone sinoe deserted them and left t!.al to fall into deoay and beoome uninhabibable.

If your Comittoe will taise this matter up with the Incians ialc adviso to as to their conolusions, it shall ve clad to ivo ti:o matter furthor consicaration. If thoy are interosted 1 will arranie to cane over and oonfer with you and then yersanally. Uiniod :"e liuva tioose two tracts of land, bcth iractioally unocoupiod and unimpored, it is not likely it will ve possible now to purohase any additional land or tho Indilins in finador County.

Plouse dive this mattor prompt attontion and lot ro hour fron you ut your exrliost oonvenienoe.
