On April 4, 1997, BLM announced its intent to prepare an environmental impact statement for the proposed revision of its surface management regulations. In the notice, BLM invited comments and suggestions on the scope of the rulemaking and analysis and informed the public that BLM will hold public meetings in seven cities during May 1997 to facilitate the public comment process. The notice gave interested parties 60 days, until June 3, 1997, to submit comments. See 62 FR 16177-16178 for information about the areas of concern with the existing surface management regulations and public comment procedures. On April 29, 1997, BLM amended the notice of intent to add public meetings in San Francisco, California. See 62 FR 23264.

BLM has received several requests to extend the public comment period to allow interested parties additional time to prepare and submit written comments. After careful consideration of these requests, we are extending the comment period until June 23, 1997.

**Public Land Order No. 7262; Modification and Revocation of 19 Secretarial Orders, 3 Public Land Orders, and 2 Bureau of Land Management Orders, which withdrew lands for the Bureau of Reclamation; California**

**AGENCY:** Bureau of Land Management, Interior.

**ACTION:** Public Land Order.

**SUMMARY:** This order modifies 10 Secretarial orders, 2 Public Land Orders, and 1 Bureau of Land Management Order to establish a 25-year term as to 133,310.80 acres of lands withdrawn for the Bureau of Reclamation. These lands have been and will remain closed to surface entry and mining, but have been and will remain open to mineral leasing. This order also revokes 18 Secretarial Orders, 1 Public Land Order, and 1 Bureau of Land Management Order insofar as they affect 482,797.32 acres of lands withdrawn for the Bureau of Reclamation. All of the lands are located in the California Desert Conservation Area as defined by Section 601 of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976, 43 U.S.C. 1781(c) (1988). Of the 482,797.32 acres being revoked, 468,051.40 acres will be opened to surface entry and mining unless closed by overlapping withdrawals or temporary segregations of record. The remaining 14,745.92 acres have been and will remain closed to surface entry and mining because those lands are included in necessary, overlapping withdrawals for the Bureau of Reclamation that are being modified by this order. The lands being opened to mining by this order are located in the California Desert Conservation Area and will be administered in accordance with the Guidelines for Mineral Exploration and Development contained in the Bureau of Land Management's California Desert Conservation Area Plan, as amended, and 43 CFR 3802 and 3809.

By virtue of the authority vested in the Secretary of the Interior by Section 204 of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976, 43 U.S.C. 1714 (1988), it is ordered as follows:

1. The following 10 Secretarial orders, 2 Public Land Orders, and 1 Bureau of Land Management Order are hereby modified to expire 25 years from the effective date of this order, unless, as a result of a review conducted before the expiration date pursuant to Section 204(f) of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976, 43 U.S.C. 1714(f) (1988), the Secretary determines that the withdrawals shall be extended insofar as they affect the lands described in a public notice published in the Federal Register on March 3, 1993 (57 FR 7599), as corrected by three correction notices published on May 4, 1992 (57 FR 19135 and 57 FR 19163) and May 26, 1993 (58 FR 30181):

The areas described within the above Secretarial orders, public land orders, and the Bureau of Land Management order aggregate 133,310.80 acres in Imperial, Riverside, and San Bernardino Counties, California.

The lands referenced above continue to be withdrawn from settlement, sale, location, or entry under the general land laws, including the mining laws, to protect the Bureau of Reclamation's Colorado River Storage Project, All American Canal Project, Senator Wash Pump Storage Project, and Yuma Reclamation Project. These lands have been and will remain open to leasing under the mineral leasing laws.

2. The following 18 Secretarial Orders, 1 Public Land Order, and 1 Bureau of Land Management Order are hereby revoked insofar as they affect the lands located in the California Desert Conservation Area, as defined by Section 601 of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976, 43 U.S.C.

The areas described within the above Secretarial orders, public land order, and Bureau of Land Management order aggregate 482,797.32 acres in Imperial, Riverside, and San Bernardino Counties, California.

3. At 10 a.m. on July 7, 1997, the lands referenced in paragraph 2 will be opened to the operation of the public land laws generally, subject to valid existing rights, the provisions of existing withdrawals, other segregations of record, and the requirements of applicable law. All valid applications received at or prior to 10 a.m. on July 7, 1997, shall be considered as simultaneously filed at that time. Those received thereafter shall be considered in the order of filing.

4. At 10 a.m. on July 7, 1997, the lands referenced in paragraph 2 will be opened to location and entry under the

United States mining laws, subject to valid existing rights, the provisions of existing withdrawals, other segregations of record, and the requirements of applicable law. Appropriation of any of the lands referenced in paragraph 2 of this order under the general mining laws prior to the date and time of restoration is unauthorized. Any such attempted appropriation, including attempted adverse possession under 30 U.S.C. 38 (1988), shall vest no rights against the United States. Acts required to establish a location and to initiate a right of possession are governed by State law where not in conflict with Federal law. The Bureau of Land Management will not intervene in disputes between rival locators over possessory rights since Congress has provided for such determinations in local courts.

Title: 30 CFR 250, Subpart O, Training of Lessee and Contractor Employees Engaged in Oil and Gas and Sulphur Operations in the OCS.

OMB Number: 1010-0078.

Abstract: Respondents provide information and maintain records on the training of certain employees working in the Outer Continental Shelf (OCS). Training organizations submit training programs for initial accreditation and subsequent renewal; request exceptions to training requirements; submit course schedules and letters with course rosters; and maintain records of training programs and trainees. Lessees may request approval of alternative training programs, and they must provide training drills to new employees and record the results. The MMS uses the information to ensure that certain workers in the OCS are properly trained in the use of equipment and procedures in drilling, well-completion, well-workover, and well-servicing well control operations and production safety system operations. The information is necessary to verify personnel training compliance with the requirements. Responses to this collection of information are mandatory. The information collected is required in the final rule published in the Federal Register on February 5, 1997 (62 FR 5320, as corrected in 62 FR 7298 on February 18, 1997), amending 30 CFR part 250, subpart O. The rule became effective on March 5, 1997.

Description of Respondents: Federal OCS oil and gas and sulfur lessee and training organizations.

Estimated Number of Respondents: 185.

Frequency: The reporting and recordkeeping requirements and number of responses vary for each section and are mostly on occasion or annual (see chart below).

At that time the notice stated the designations were final and would remain in effect until further evaluation and/or adjustments of the National Register Boundary occurred. Through the existing Memorandum of Agreement concerning ORV management strategies, the Glennallen District has consulted with the Alaska State Historic Preservation Officer and concurrence has been given regarding the reopening of previously closed or partially closed trails assuring compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended.

#### A. Limited Designations

##### 1. Limited Season of Use—166,000 Acres

11. Yost/Top of the World Trail, declared non historic in 1987. This trail originates along the Richardson Highway, north and east of the National Register District.

Additional trails may be opened as required federal legislation, pertinent to historic properties and environmental concerns, are met. The above designations become effective upon publication in the FR and will remain in effect until rescinded and/or modified by the Authorized Officer.

Lessees may request approval of alternative training programs, and they must provide training drills to new employees and record the results. The MMS uses the information to ensure that certain workers in the OCS are properly trained in the use of equipment and procedures in drilling, well-completion, well-workover, and well-servicing well control operations and production safety system operations. The information is necessary to verify personnel training compliance with the requirements. Responses to this collection of information are mandatory. The information collected is required in the final rule published in the Federal Register on February 5, 1997 (62 FR 5320, as corrected in 62 FR 7298 on February 18, 1997), amending 30 CFR part 250, subpart O. The rule became effective on March 5, 1997.

**Description of Respondents:** Federal OCS oil and gas and sulfur lessee and training organizations.

**Estimated Number of Responders:** 185.

**Frequency:** The reporting and recordkeeping requirements and number of responses vary for each section and are mostly on occasion or annual (see chart below).

The proposed PLO package has been signed by SD and forwarded to our Washington Office for their processing and subsequent submittal to the Assistant Secretary for his approval.

In a telephone conversation on January 14, SD informed Robert Johnson, your Regional Director, of the status of the PLO package. Mr. Johnson concurred with our decision to implement the recommendations and supported the submission of the proposed PLO. He also requested that we send a copy of our proposed PLO package to you. These lands have been and remain open to leasing under the mineral leasing laws. They were withdrawn to protect the Bureau of Reclamation's Colorado River Storage Project, All American Canal Project, Senator Wash Pump Storage Project, and Yuma Reclamation Project.

2. The following 18 Secretarial Orders, 1 Public Land Order, and 1 Bureau of

At 10 a.m. on (insert date 30 days after date of publication in the FEDERAL REGISTER), the lands referenced in paragraph 2 will be opened to the operation of the public land laws generally, subject to valid existing rights, the provisions of existing withdrawals, other segregations of record, and the requirements of applicable law. All valid applications received at or prior to 10 a.m. on (insert date 30 days after date of publication in the FEDERAL REGISTER), shall be considered as simultaneously filed at that time. Those received thereafter shall be considered in the order of filing.

4. At a.m. on (insert date 30 days after date of publication in the FEDERAL REGISTER), the lands referenced in paragraph 2 will be opened to location and entry under the United States mining laws, subject to valid existing rights, the provisions of existing withdrawals, other segregations of record, and the requirements of applicable law. Appropriation of any of the lands referenced in paragraph 2 of this order under the general mining laws prior to the date and time of restoration is unauthorized. Any such attempted appropriation, including attempted adverse possession under 30 U.S.C. 38 (1988), shall vest no rights against the United States. Acts required to establish a

location and to initiate a right of possession are governed by State law where not in conflict with Federal law. The Bureau of Land Management will not intervene in disputes between rival locators over possessory rights since Congress has provided for such determinations in local courts.

We are transmitting a Public Land Order (PLO) that modifies or revokes 19 Secretarial Orders, 3 Public Land Orders, and 2 Bureau of Land Management Orders (collectively hereafter called Orders). The PLO (a) modifies 13 Orders, establishing a 25 year term, insofar as they affect 133,310.80 acres of lands withdrawn for the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR), and (b) revokes 20 Orders insofar as they affect 482,797.32 acres of lands withdrawn for BOR. The proposed PLO implements the recommendations of a joint BOR/BLM withdrawal review project in 1991 and 1992, which reviewed the status of all public lands withdrawn for BOR in California. All of the lands affected by these 24 Orders are located in the California Desert Conservation Area.

This action will have no significant impact on the quality of the human environment, and a detailed statement pursuant to Section 102(2)(C) of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 is not required.

This proposed action has been reviewed and approved by the Pacific Southwest Regional Solicitor's Office. No substantive change was made in the preparation of the attached PLO. Your approval is recommended.

## **MODIFICATION AND REVOCATION OF 24 ORDERS; IMPERIAL, RIVERSIDE, AND SAN BERNARDINO COUNTIES, CALIFORNIA**

**ISSUE SUMMARY:** The proposed Public Land Order (PLO) modifies or revokes 19 Secretarial Orders, 3 Public Land Orders, and 2 Bureau of Land Management Orders (collectively hereafter called Orders). The PLO (a) modifies 13 Orders, establishing a 25 year term, insofar as they affect 133,310.80 acres of lands withdrawn for the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR), and (b) revokes 20 Orders insofar as they affect 482,797.32 acres of lands withdrawn for BOR. The lands will be opened to surface entry and mining unless closed by overlapping withdrawals or temporary segregations of record. The lands have been and continue to be open to mineral leasing

**BACKGROUND:** The lands were withdrawn by the 24 Orders from surface entry and mining to protect BOR's Colorado River Storage Project, All American Canal Project, Senator Wash Pump Storage Project, and Yuma Reclamation Project. **All of the lands affected by these 24 Orders are located in the California Desert Conservation Area (CDCA).** For the 13 Orders being modified, the lands are still needed by BOR for reclamation purposes. For the 20 Orders being revoked, the lands are no longer needed by BOR for that purpose, and the revocations are necessary to facilitate BLM's land tenure adjustment program in CDCA.

**The proposed PLO implements the recommendations of a joint BOR/BLM withdrawal review project in 1991 and 1992, which reviewed the status of all lands withdrawn for BOR in California, pursuant to section 204 of FLPMA. CA-910 has discussed the proposed PLO with the Regional Director, Lower Colorado Region, BOR, who concurs.**

The proposed action is in compliance with the *California Desert Conservation Area Plan*. The revocations will facilitate both management of the lands by one agency and BLM's land tenure adjustment program in CDCA, which is authorized by section 601 of FLPMA and section 702 of the *California Desert Protection Act of 1994* (CDPA). BLM is involved in on-going land exchanges with the State of California State Lands Commission, Catellus Development Corporation, owners of inholdings within either the national parks or wilderness areas, and other members of the public who want to exchange non-public land, as directed by CDPA. **Because the lands, that are being opened to mining by this order, are located in CDCA, they will be administered in accordance with the Guidelines for Mineral Exploration and Development contained in the CDCA Plan, as amended, and 43 CFR 3802 and 3809.**

**SOLICITOR REVIEW:** The public land order has been reviewed and approved for legal sufficiency by the Regional Solicitor's Office.

**POSITION OF MAJOR CONSTITUENCIES AND NATIVE AMERICANS:** As part of the public involvement process for the joint BOR/BLM withdrawal review project, several meetings were held with the Coachella Valley Water District and Imperial Irrigation District during June through December of 1991. BOR/BLM also gave presentations to the Board of Supervisors for Imperial, Riverside, and San Bernardino Counties. BOR/BLM also consulted with the 36 Native American tribal organizations that are located in the CDCA. Since the passage of FLPMA, BLM has actively consulted with the 36 Native American tribal organizations about all aspects of BLM's programs in CDCA. No opposition to the proposed action was identified as a result of those consultations or meetings.

The proposed action:

(a) revokes, either in part or in their entirety, 20 of the Orders, listed above, insofar as it affects 482,797.32 acres of public land withdrawn for the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR). All of the lands are located in the California Desert Conservation Area (CDCA), as established by section 601 of FLPMA. The lands are no longer needed for reclamation purposes, and the revocations are necessary to facilitate completion of BLM's ongoing land tenure adjustment program in CDCA. This action will open the lands to the public land laws or mining unless closed by overlapping withdrawals or temporary segregations of record. The lands have been and continue

to be open to mineral leasing. See Attachment 1 for a list of the public lands that will be revoked by the proposed action.

(b) continues, in part or in their entirety, 13 of the Orders listed above, insofar as they affect 133,310.80 acres of public lands withdrawn for BOR. All of the lands are located in CDCA and are still needed by BOR for reclamation purposes. The lands have been and continue to be segregated from all forms of appropriation under the public land laws including mining, but not mineral leasing. The withdrawals will be continued for a period of 25 years, pursuant to section 204 of FLPMA. See Attachment 2 for a list of the public lands that will be continued, in a withdrawn status, by the proposed action.

**The proposed action only affects public lands, which are located inside of CDCA and withdrawn by one of these 24 Orders.**

**BACKGROUND:**

During 1991 and 1992, a withdrawal review of BOR's reclamation projects in California was jointly conducted by BOR and BLM. As a result of that withdrawal review, it was determined that only a portion of the remaining withdrawn lands in California needed to remain in a withdrawal status. The joint BOR/BLM withdrawal review project concluded with recommendations as to which public lands should remain withdrawn (i.e., to continue) and those that should have their withdrawn status terminated (i.e. not to continue). The proposed action is the implementation of those recommendations. The joint withdrawal project was conducted under the terms of the Interagency Agreement between BOR and BLM, dated October 10, 1991.

As a result of the joint BOR/BLM withdrawal review, BLM published a public notice in the *Federal Register* on March 3, 1992 (57FR7599). That notice identified those withdrawn lands, in the CDCA, that BOR/BLM had recommended remain withdrawn for BOR. That notice and the three corrections to it, are contained in Attachment 2. Also, BOR/BLM identified the withdrawn lands, in the CDCA, that were no longer needed by BOR. However, that list was never published in the *Federal Register*. That list is contained in Attachment 1.

The proposed action is in compliance with the *California Desert Conservation Area Plan of 1980*, as amended, which was approved on December 19, 1980 by then Secretary of the Interior Cecil Andrus. The plan was reviewed and concurred in by

then Secretary of the Interior James Watt on April 2, 1981. The latest amendment to the plan was approved on April 27, 1993. The public lands, that will be opened as the result of the proposed action, will be managed in accordance with the plan. The public lands that will be opened to mining will be administered in accordance with the Guidelines for Mineral Exploration and Development contained in the plan, as amended, and 43 CFR 3802 and 3809. Preliminary mineral evaluation of these public lands show that they have minimal potential for locatable or leasable minerals.

In addition to implementing the actions recommended by the joint BOR/BLM withdrawal review project, the proposed action will facilitate the completion of BLM's land tenure adjustment program in CDCA. Both FLPMA and the *California Desert Protection Act of 1994* (16 U.S.C. 410aaa) direct BLM to consolidate public ownership within the national parks units, wilderness areas designated by Congress, and elsewhere in CDCA. Currently, BLM is involved in on-going land exchanges with the State of California State Lands Commission, Catellus Development Corporation, owners of inholdings within either the national parks or wilderness areas, and other members of the public who want to exchange non-public land, located in CDCA, with the U. S. Government.

IM No. 96-145 provided guidance for processing withdrawal reviews using FLPMA sections 204(a) and 204(l). FOs were requested to use innovative approaches to expedite processing withdrawal revocations and terminations. Based on agreement with the Department, BLM will use DM 603 authority and FLPMA section 204(a) authority to revoke or continue many withdrawals that were formerly being processed using the authority of section 204(l). Previously these 24 Orders were processed using section 204(l) authority. They were not forwarded to the President or the Congress for the mandated reviews.

As part of the public involvement process for the joint BOR/BLM withdrawal review project, several meetings were held with the Coachella Valley Water District and Imperial Irrigation District during June through December of 1991. BOR/BLM also gave presentations to the Board of Supervisors for Imperial, Riverside, and San Bernardino Counties. BOR/BLM also consulted with the 36 Native American tribal organizations that located in the CDCA. Since the passage of FLPMA, BLM has actively consulted with the 36 Native American tribal organizations about all aspects of BLM's programs in CDCA. No opposition to the proposed action was identified as a result of those consultations or meetings.

#### **NEPA COMPLIANCE:**

This proposed action is categorically excluded pursuant to 516 DM 6, Appendix 5.4E(1) and (3), and none of the exceptions listed in 516 DM 2, Appendix 2, are applicable to this proposed action. There would be no significant change in the human environment as a result of the proposed action for the foreseeable future.

No further NEPA documentation is required.
