

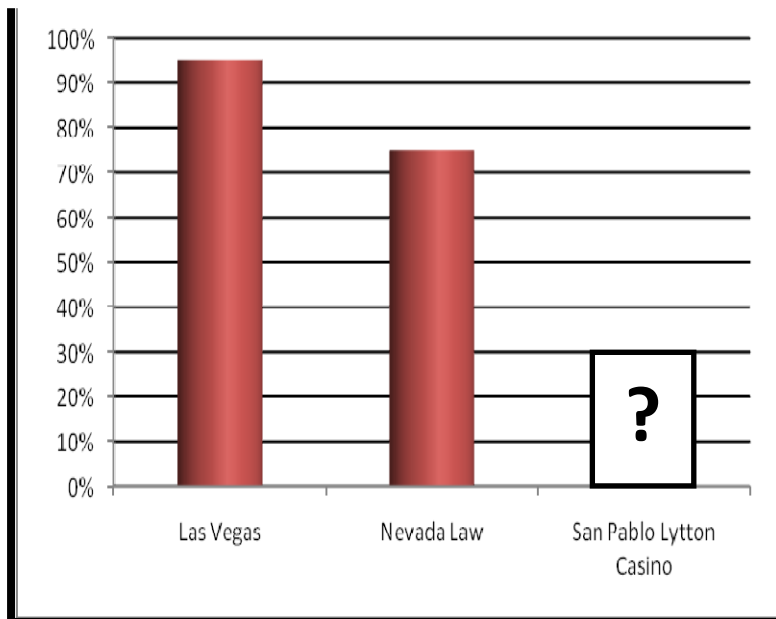


## CASINO SAN "PAY LOW"

What are your Odds of Winning (*or Losing*) Today?

- California doesn't require casinos to disclose their payout rates. So unless San Pablo Lytton Casino decides to make its payout records public, you have no way of knowing your odds of winning (or losing).
- San Pablo Lytton Casino had Gross Gaming Revenues of \$181 million in 2010-11,<sup>1</sup> and it claims to have paid out "over \$50 million" in winnings last year.<sup>2</sup>

If the Casino's claims are true, its payout rate is **28%.**



- Nevada law requires that the payout rate for slot machines be at least

**75%.<sup>3</sup>**

- Last year the average payout rate for slot machines in the Las Vegas area was

**94%.<sup>4</sup>**
