Dear Sir:-

We are looking for a piece of land to grow corn for feeding our dairy. Right close to us at the Lytton station is fifty acres, which I understand belongs to the Indian department, which lies idle. It has never been cultivated for some years. The soil is very suitable for growing corn. As it is very close to our institution, which, as possibly you know, cares for the delinquent and underprivileged boys of the state, of which we have some two hundred. We would like to cultivate that land and put in corn to be used as I have previously stated.

Would you please let us have a line, advising us what the possibilities are of us operating this particular piece of land.
