RE: Off-reservation casinos in California

Between November 14th and 22nd, we interviewed 800 statewide voters (+/- 3.5%), and 300 voters each (+/- 5.7%) in Yuba and Madera counties, testing voter opinion on the subject of off-reservation Indian gaming casinos. Findings from the survey are as follows:

• California voters strongly <u>OPPOSE</u> tribes building <u>off-</u>reservation casinos.

• 72% of California voters believe any decision to change Prop 1A to allow off-reservation gaming should be made by the voters.
