I received your communication concerning Indian gaming in California, specifically activities by the Bear River Band of the Rohnerville Rancheria. I share your frustration over the construction activities and disregard for environmental standards.

As you know, I have recently urged the Governor to continue state compact negotiations with California tribes, in part because I believe it strengthens the state's ability to affect gaming operations. Nonetheless, although under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act tribe's are legally able to operate gaming casinos, they are accountable under provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act. Therefore, I have written Ada E. Deer, Acting Chair of the National Indian Gaming Commission and Assistant Secretary of Indian Affairs of the Interior Department and asked that she assert their jurisdiction at Rohnerville Rancheria. I have enclosed a copy of my letter.
