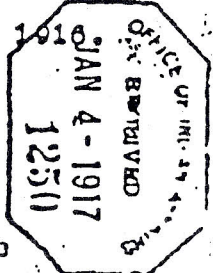

Dear Sir:

Replying to your favor of Dec. 4, 1916, above reference, desiring to know why I have included in the census submitted in my letter of January 4, 1916, some Hawaiians as belonging to the above named bands of Indians, have the honor to report that at the time I submitted this census and accompanying report of these Indians was under the impression by reason of intermarriages and affiliation with the native Indians might properly be considered in connection with the native Indians. Not being fully advised as to the status of these Hawaiian Indians or the extent those living in Sacramento may have adopted the habits of civilized life, before further justifying my recommendation would prefer to make further investigation. I also desire to investigate and be more sure as number and status of Alex Flue and Old Joe bands, as well as those referred to in El Dorado and Amador Counties, some of whom may be persuaded to adopt the proposed purchase of the land as a village base. I will return to the vicinity of these several bands as early in the spring as possible when I hope to be able to make more satisfactory report in the premises.
