Dear Ms. Schmit:

This letter is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated December 29, 2015, received by the Office of Federal Acknowledgment (OFA) on January 4, 2016. You requested copies of documents pertaining to the following four groups: (1). the Kern Valley Indian Community (Petitioner #47), (2) the Tinoqui-Chalola Council Katanemuck and Yowlumne Tejon Indians (Petitioner #165), (3) the Chumash Council of Bakersfiled or Chalon Indian Nation, Chalon Indian Council of Bakersfield (Petitioner #294), and (4) the Tabatulabals of Kern Valley (Petitioner #318).

You also specifically requested copies of documents from these four groups, as follows: (1) the original letters of intent to petition and any new letter of intent submitted after July 31, 2015 under the new regulations; (2) the "executive summary of the history for each of these groups"; and (3) "any letter, document or email that states a group has chosen to join the reaffirmed Tejon Tribe."

With regard to item 1, the Department's previous regulations required letters of intent as a starting point for each group seeking to be acknowledged as an Indian tribe. However, the 2015 regulations do not require letters of intent – only "complete documented petitions" to begin the process. Therefore, enclosed are copies of the letters of intent of the four groups that had submitted them under the 1994 regulations. With regard to item 2, we have not received partial or complete documented petitions from these four groups either under the 1994 regulations or 2015 regulations. Therefore, we do not have any "executive summaries" to copy for your request. With regard to item 3, we did not locate any record pertaining to any group stating that it chooses "to join the reaffirmed Tejon Tribe."

Since you are considered an "other requestor," the cost is broken down as follows: one quarter hour of managerial search time at \$15.25 per 1/4 hour or \$15.25. You are entitled to the first two hours of search time at no cost. No cost is being charged for managerial review. The duplication

of 6 images at \$0.15 per page is \$.90; however, you are entitled to the first 100 copies at no cost. The fee for providing copies of these 6 images is less than \$50.00. Therefore, you are not being charged for any of the costs in accordance with 43 CFR 2.16(b)(2).
