The Tejon Indian Tribe, in compliance with The Energy Policy Act of 2005 (25 U.S.C. 3501 et seq.) seeks funding from the Secretary of the Department of the Interior to assess and evaluate the oil, gas and water renewable energy resources that can be generated by the Tejon Indian Tribe's Biomass Thermal Conversion Renewable Energy Demonstration Project. The Tribe has already successfully obtained Department of Energy Technical Assistance Award and data/research to begin to define the available waste inputs and some possible purchasers of renewable energy resources in Kern County CA (the Tribe's federally designated Service Delivery Area (SDA))[1], and we will further seek & incorporate DEMD data and BIA Natural Resources data into our analysis & planning during the course of this proposed project. The project includes a collaborative agreement with the White Blanket Allotment of Indian Land that is owned by members of the non-federally recognized Tubatulabal Tribe.
