Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments related to the Proposed Tule River Tribe 40± Acre Fee to Trust Transfer. In regard to the project and the Environmental Assessment (EA) prepared for the abovementioned action, the Tulare County Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) submits the following comments and proposed conditions recommended to be incorporated before approval:

SAFETY

1. Uses such as, stadiums, casinos, and other uses which attract large amounts of people to a concentrated area shall be prohibited. Density and population factors from a proposed project are of concern with the close proximity to the Porterville Airport and as such, all future projects shall be reviewed for consistency with ALUC policy.

TRAFFIC PATTERN/HEIGHT

- 2. The applicant shall submit all future proposed projects which intrude greater then 150 feet above the ground for review to the Tulare County Airport Land Use Commission to determine whether the project will pose any impacts to Porterville Municipal Airport or the surrounding community.
- 3. As a condition of approval, all projects (existing and future) shall adhere to the 50% structural coverage per parcel limitation.
- 4. The applicant of any proposed project which intrudes greater then 200 feet above the ground shall be required to submit and file the 7460-1 form to the Federal Aviation Administration. The Tulare County Airport Land Use Commission shall receive a copy of any correspondence between the Tribe, City of Porterville and the FAA regarding the project.

These comments and conditions were developed upon analyzing the project and Environmental Assessment with the Tulare County Comprehensive Airport Land Use Plan.
